
#### **Police of Finland**

- 3. "Special systems"
  - 1-2 for national units
- The Need for Executive Assistance remains



#### **Counter RPAS**

- Preventive actions
  - Mobile application by the Finnish Transport Safety Agency
  - "Anti Drone Zone" signs
  - Integrated geofencing
- Preventive and reactive technology
  - Detection radar test
  - Several different solutions and technologies
  - Beam rifle (or similar jammer) needed?
